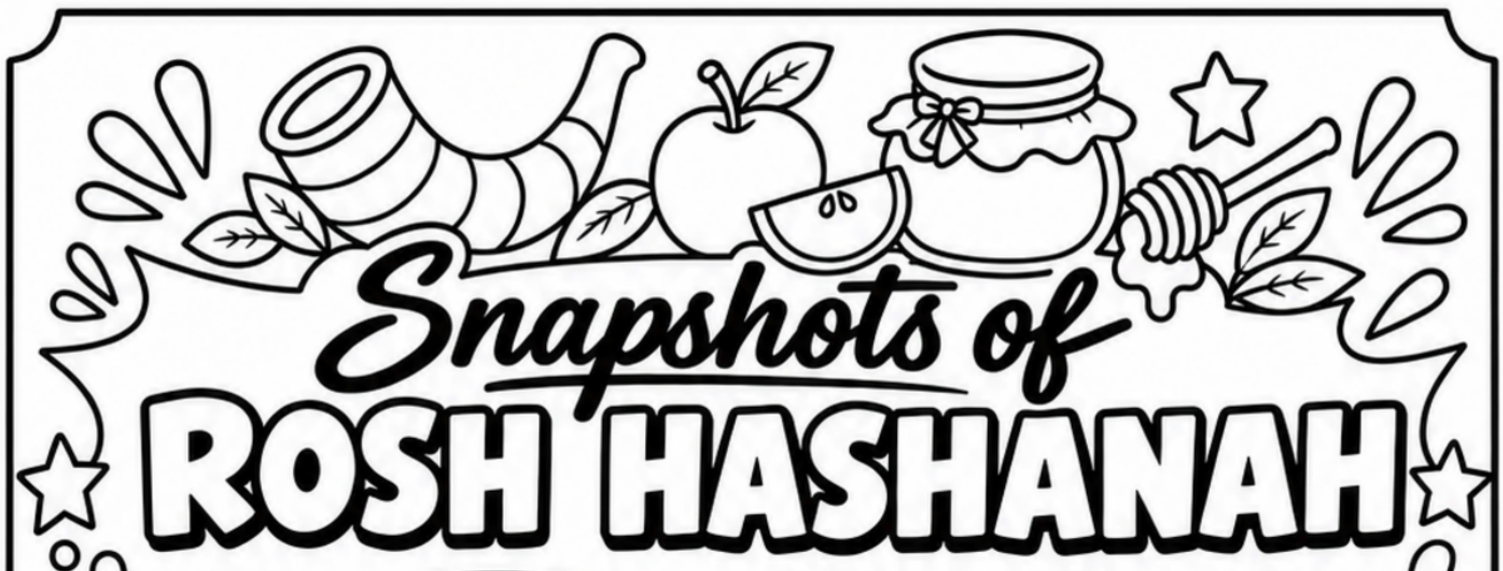




Snapshots of ROSH HASHANAH

We dip apples in honey to wish for a sweet and happy new year.

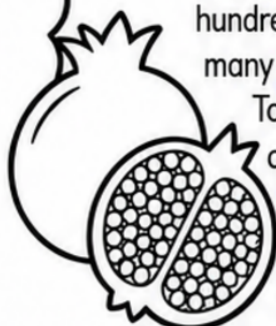
ROUND CHALLAH

Challah is baked in a round shape instead of a long braid. The circle has no beginning and no end. It reminds us of how one year flows into the next.



POMEGRANATES

Pomegranates are filled with hundreds of tiny seeds. Their many seeds remind us of the Torah's 613 commandments, called mitzvot. We eat pomegranates as a reminder to do mitzvot and good deeds in the new year.



SHOFAR

The *shofar* is made from a ram's horn. Its loud sound is like a wake-up call. It reminds us to think about our actions and choose to be honest and kind in the new year.

We wish one another *Shana Tova*, which means "good year" in Hebrew. Saying it is a way to wish others a happy new year.





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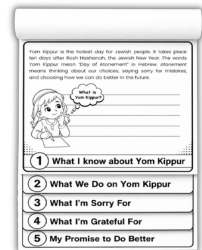
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
